This week, I thought <u>class 1 and 2</u> could have a go at writing some new words to a song! Have a listen to 'In my garden' and try learning the verses, then, it's your



turn....... think of some other minibeasts you can find and add them to the song. Did you notice that the name of the minibeasts in the song start with the same sound as them, like Alf the ant and Will the woodlouse? This is called alliteration. Can you do that with your minibeasts? You could make it even better by doing the same with the way they move, for example, Alf the ant could amble along and Will could waddle!!

If you manage to go out in the garden or for a walk, you could try looking for minibeasts and discovering where they like to live. You could also draw some pictures of your minibeasts and make them into cartoon characters!

For <u>class 3 and 4</u>, your challenge follows on from last week with the 'Cup Song' - how did you get on? I'm still trying to master the part where you have to turn and tap the bottom then swap hands!!

Like class 1 and 2, you could always get creative and draw a picture of your troll or whatever the music makes you think of - let your imagination run wild!!
