












September 2021

It is fair to say, the end of term has been challenging. To have survived so much of the last year with very few Covid cases in our community was fortunate for us all, but that has changed over the last 4 weeks. We hope you all stay safe from this over the summer holiday period and we can start next term without this still hanging over us.

As things stand, here are the key details for September:

- Class organisation:
 - Class 1: EYFS & Year 1 Mr Ottewell-Taylor, Mrs Walker and Mrs Wilde
 - Class 2: Year 2 Mrs Kalarus, Mr Hunt (Friday afternoons), Miss Walker, Mrs Carne & Mrs Wilde
 - Class 3: Year 3 & Year 4 Mr Watts, Mr Hunt (Mondays), Mrs Connell, Mrs Carne & Mrs Wilde
 - Class 4: Year 5 and Year 6 Miss Pinfield, Mr Hunt (Tuesday afternoons), Mrs Thomson, Mrs Cocking & Mrs
 White

In addition, Mrs Lane and Miss Walker will work with the juniors and the infants respectively for music and PE.

- PE kit school kit must be worn to school on PE days (teachers to notify parents of which days). For details of regulation kit, please see the uniform page on the school website: http://www.harrowbarrow.cornwall.sch.uk/uniform/
 All school branded uniform and PE kit can be ordered through Wovina (click Wovina on the uniform page).
- The school day starts at 8.50am. Classroom doors will open to pupils at 8.40am. Parents and carers are politely requested to stay outside. The school day ends at 3.10pm.
- Classes will continue using existing entrances/exits to/from their classrooms.
- The one way system will continue to operate, not for Covid reasons but to reduce congestion outside the Class 2 drop-off and pick up area.
- In line with government guidance, the wearing of face coverings on site will be optional.
- Breakfast and after school clubs will return to the pre-Covid offer; breakfast club from 8am in the staffroom with breakfast and after school club until 5.15pm in Class 2.
- Classes will no longer operate in bubbles and will be able to mix at break and lunchtimes.
- Classrooms will no longer be set up so that children sit in rows, although good hand hygiene and ventilation will be maintained.

Please note, Cornwalll Council has advised schools to prepare for further disruption next term and to be prepared to reintroduce protective measures again if necessary.
