Free School Meals & Pupil Premium Support

Did you know that if you are in receipt of certain benefits, your child is eligible for Free School Meals (FSM)? All infant children, those in EYFS, Year 1 and Year 2, automatically receive a FSM through the Universal Free School Meal scheme. However, if these children aren't registered with Cornwall Council under the FSM scheme, they won't automatically be eligible for a FSM when they join Year 3. In addition, for each child eligible for a FSM, the school receives pupil premium funding to put towards their education.

A child is eligible for free school meals if their parent/carer (or the child themselves) receives any of the following benefits:

Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods).

Income Support (IS)

- Job Seekers' Allowance (Income-Based) and equal based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income Related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA-IR) and equal based Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit (CTC) with an annual income of less than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Guarantee Element of Pension Credit (GPC)
- Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 (IAA) Supports

If you are claiming the benefits listed below you are **not** eligible for free school meals. This is regardless of what other benefits/credits are being claimed.

- Working Tax Credit
- Contribution-Based Job Seeker's Allowance and/or Contribution-Based Employment and Support Allowance
